

50 Years in the Ministry

One of the highlights of UUMA days at General Assembly is the message of the representative of the 50 year class. Recently there has been some confusion about how this is determined. Though ordained in 1952, I was notified by the UUMA that I am a member of the 50 year class in 2000. Mel Van de Workeen, ordained in 1951, was also notified that he was a member of the year 2000 50 year class. This is only a problem for those of us who were Universalists before merger.

How is the list determined? The policy, worked out in the early years of consolidation (George Spencer was involved in setting it up), is that the 50 year class is composed of those Unitarians who were given the green light for settlement by the Fellowship Committee, and those Universalists who were licensed by a Fellowship Committee, State or Central, in the year, 50 years ago.

Who creates the list? The UUMA (not the Department of Ministry) office person in Boston compiles the list from the records of the UUA's Ministry Office. This is not a UUA recognition but a UUMA recognition.

The problem, if it is one, will go away in ten years. In the meantime, if you are unhappy about it, contact the UUMA not the UUA.

Report from Our Representative to the Council on Church Staff Finances

A review of the various welfare funds through June 30, 1999 held by the UUA was done by a Council subcommittee, which I chair. Our findings are that everything is in order. The funds are being used appropriately and the unexpended balances fully accounted for. In our review, we discovered that at the above date, the UUA had on hand over \$900,000 for welfare purposes.

The subcommittee, meeting with Jerry Gabert and Richard Crowell of the Finance Office, concluded that a major reason for this "on hand " amount is primarily due to the "reticence of potential beneficiaries" to apply for assistance.

Thanks to the 1999 Living Tradition Service Offering at GA and funds for Ministerial Aid, the UUA was able to assist 107 ministers reduce their student debt by over \$200,000.

At its May meeting, the Unitarian Service Pension Society will be considering a 5 percent increase in the service gratuity.

Ralph Mero has been incapacitated with a serious sciatic nerve problem, but stays in almost daily contact with the office.

The dates will be April 6, 7, and 8, 2001. The planners hope strongly that the UURMAPA Board will hold its spring meeting in conjunction with the conference as in the past.
