NOVEMBER MINUTES - Judy Gibson

The minutes and reports from last month were approved as revised.

PRELIMINARY BUDGET FOR 2017 - Joel Weaver

The budget as amended last month was approved as a working document, subject to change next year with receipt of grant funds. Jim reported that he has received word that the TeMP grant has awarded \$11,500 to the program, finances through UURMaPA.

MEMBERSHIP TASK FORCE – Marni Harmony

 Marni and Judy W shared the final report of the Task Force:

Here are the two recommendations from the Membership Task Force to the UURMaPA Board for its December, 2016 meeting:

 • The Task Force on Membership recommends that the UURMaPA Board develop a proposal for a two-tiered system of membership, as follows:

All retired ministers and partners are considered members upon formal retirement with the UUA, and are entitled to receive Elderberries, attend conferences and other events, and to receive communications from UURMaPA.

After one year of membership, and annually thereafter, all members are invited
to become Sustaining Members by paying dues (the amount to be determined by
the UURMaPA Board). Sustaining Membership entitles members to attend
UURMaPA conferences and the luncheon at G.A. at a reduced rate, to
participate in an UURMaPA peer support group, to be part of the UURMaPA
chapter of the UUMA (if such a step is approved, see below), and to serve
UURMaPA in leadership and program roles.

This proposal or any version of it acted upon by the UURMaPA Board shall be sent to the membership via an article in Elderberries and discussed at UURMaPA conferences and at General Assembly. With advice from these conversations and the second recommendation suggested below, the new membership structure could be implemented January 1, 2018.

• A new Task Force be formed with an equal number of members selected by the Boards of UURMaPA and UUMA to review during 2017 the current relationship between the two organizations and to make recommendations for changes. In particular, the task force would be charged with considering (a) the impact on UUMA and UURMaPA donations from retired ministers if there were a dues system in UURMAPA, and (b) in a two-tier system of UURMaPA membership, whether the dues-paying UURMaPA members would be considered a chapter of UUMA or have some other formal organizational connection with the UUMA.

The task force members listed above unanimously approved this report, and they submit it to the Board for deliberation, sharing with membership, further decisions and followup to implement resulting plan by January 2018.

Board discussion included:

- Need to accommodate to varied financial situations of people who wish to become Sustaining Members,
- Seeing greater numbers of retirees in recent years, and higher participation in conferences and other UURMaPA programs new plan could increase sense of buy-in.
- Positive factors in considering UUMA collaboration, including changes in UUMA focus to include partners, assistance by their paid staff (UURMaPA leadership is all volunteer)
 Further discussions will be held at January Board meeting, and plan of action should be set following the February in-person meetings in Santa Barbara.

BYLAWS REVISION FINALIZED – Judy Gibson

The bylaws revisions needed to change the Caring Network to Connections Network were submitted to the membership for comment in the Fall Elderberries, and are now ready for final approval by the Board. *Judy G moved, Marni seconded* **That the following revisions to the bylaws be approved**. *Passed unanimously*.

Article IV - ADMINISTRATION

Section 1

Section 1

The Board of this organization shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Newsletter Editor, a <u>Connections Network</u> Chair and three Members-at-large.

Article V - ELECTIONS

 The officers, three Members-at-large, and a Nominating Committee, consisting of a chair and two others, shall be elected by the members.

The President, the Vice President, the <u>Connections Network Chair</u>, two Members-at-large, and the Chair of the Nominating Committee, shall be elected in odd-numbered years.

These changes will be submitted to the State of Massachusetts by the Secretary, and updated Bylaws will be posted on the UURMaPA website.

NOMNATING COMMITTEE REPORT – Jim Eller

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Jim reported that the slate of nominees is about ready, and shared one or two names under consideration. Not all have been confirmed.

(Secretary's Note: During the meeting the Board did not have in mind the nominating process schedule as outlined in Bylaws and Operating Procedures, which is as follows.. "Before December 1 preceding the election, the Nominating Committee shall poll the

membership for suggestions of nominees. From these and their own suggestions, the committee shall make its nominations and submit these names to the Board for consultation, with information about the qualifications of each nominee. If the Board raises concerns regarding any nominee, these will be reviewed and considered. Final decision remains with the Nominating Committee, which will notify the membership of their nominees by April 1."

This year, the Board has not yet had opportunity to review the entire proposed slate. In past years, the proposed slate has been listed in the Winter *Elderberries*, deadline January 15. If the process takes longer, nominees will have to be announced through another method.

- At-large Position #3 Good Offices and UUMA Liaison (term 2017-2019)
- Nominating Committee Chair (term 2017-2019)

RETIREMENT SEMINAR (March 27-31, 2017) - Doug Gallagher

Doug reported that 30 people are registered (46 with staff), and they are looking for 10 more registrations soon.

CONNECTIONS NETWORK – Liz McMaster

Liz reported that she has many Connector vacancies, and new ones are opening. She very much appreciates any assistance other Board members can offer in recruiting for these open spots. *Jim said he will give some time and effort to help recruit new Connectors*.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY PLANNING

Marni has applied for a slot for Collegial Conversations during Ministry Days – one of the first applications they received! No word yet.

WEBSITE UPDATE

Webmaster Duane Fickheisen sent a report to the Board (*with reports attached*). He reports that the primary remaining tasks are enabling online conference registrations and payments and creating several new pages for existing content that needs to be moved over from the old site. He sent Board members a temporary link to review the site, and all have taken at least some opportunity to review it. *Duane still invites feedback on the new format and content.*

BASIC UURMAPA PAMPHLET

Judy W sent all Board members a draft of the revised pamphlet content, and has asked for feedback. It will go the printer in time for distribution at the February Santa Barbara conference – first order will be 200.
