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#### Conferences-Anne Spatola

Anne Spatola's Board Report for April, 2021.

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Attended several meetings with the Spring conference planners and provided input.

185 Met with Barbro Hansson and discussed possible plans for the Fall conference.

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- The Spring conference plans are being handled very well by the planners.
- They are meeting weekly and putting out messages with the schedule to encourage attendance.
- The planners are paying close attention to details that might impact the
  overall presentation. Excellent guidance is being provided by the technical
  support, Liz Roper. A back-up for technical support was secured. Joel
  Nelson will assist Liz as needed.
- Outstanding presenters for the keynote and service of remembrance should affect attendance. 90 have already registered for the spring event.
- Dennis and MaryKay Hamilton will emcee the conference and there will be more opportunities for getting reacquainted. There will not be any focused workshops.' Most of the conference will be pre-recorded except for the service of remembrance and a few of the Board pieces. There are two Odyssey presentations.

- Liz will be sending a message to the Board as some expected recorded
   messages have not been received. Apparently, some were not labeled per
   Liz' instructions and she is having a difficult time trying to identify them.
  - A dry run is planned for April 22<sup>nd</sup>. All live presenters will be invited. The Board can attend this session but there will also be a separate instructional guide on the day of the conference. Liz will notify us accordingly.

207208 The Fall conference:

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210 Barbro and I are assessing the pros and cons of conference options with close 211 attention to the cost/benefit effect.

After careful consideration and input from other ministers, Barbro has identified Bruce Marshall for the keynote speaker. Bruce will attend the spring conference so that there is no repetition in his fall presentation. However, he plans to go deeper into the "new normal" and what we all face with the changing environment and the limited choices we will have along with grieving and loss. The theme will focus on adjusting to post COVID, adjusting to the aging process and negotiating through all of these changes.

A major factor affecting the fall conference is whether it will be virtual or in person.

Barbro is conducting a cost/benefit analysis and reviewing the document from the Barbara Harris center. We have discussed the various options and the cost factors. She will do further research before a final recommendation is made. The 3 options are:

Hybrid- onsite technical professional requiring a daily fee
 Virtual only
 Onsite only with recordings of key events for a future publication

The biggest unknown is the number of potential attendees for an onsite meeting.
Given the cost of the center, we would need to charge around \$450 for
accommodations and meals with a minimum of 50 attending. The cost can be
prohibitive when taking transportation costs and the risks of travel. Barbro and I
